The Summer School project is funded by the University of Parma through the W.I.D.E. (Widening International Didactics and Education). It stems from the intention to solidify, through educational activities, the existing collaboration between the University of Parma and Bath Spa University within the framework of the GALA University network. The two institutions (specifically the Department of Humanities, Social Studies and Cultural Industries and The School of Writing, Publishing and the Humanities) are linked by common research interests and teaching applications concerning the field of Environmental Humanities, which is respectively overseen by the Laboratory of Environmental and Social Humanities in Parma and the Research Centre for Environmental Humanities in Bath.


