TITLE: SOFT SKILLS FOR INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION

## **SHORT DESCRIPTION:**

After briefly introducing the concept of soft skills and the classical approaches to intercultural communication as a field of study, the course aims to develop the capacity of:

- 1. Reflecting upon the verbal and non-verbal factors that can influence communication in a multicultural setting;
- 2. Identifying the soft skills which are necessary to interact with people who do not share our cultural and linguistic background;
- 3. Identifying and deconstruct cultural stereotypes and essentialist visions of culture.

The course consists of online activities (video-lessons and discussion inputs) and a final seminar.
